

## Conclusions

This is not a lens for beginners. As with any manual lens the viewfinder gets dark at higher f-stops. This can be countered with a good focus light and the display/viewfinder settings on your camera.

To get the focus right on spot the magnification should be chosen according the subject size and then the camera moved towards the desired position.

With a little bit of practicing this lens is very capable of producing pleasing photos in a very good quality regarding colors and sharpness.

To avoid flare on the front glass cover and therefore loss of contrast, I recommend to use a kind of short lens hood which can be easily made by yourself with a strip of black plastic foil.

If you are willing to trade the comfort of auto focus, auto aperture and the computational features of your camera against a very low price, this lens is a good choice.

## Would I buy it?

Yes, if I would not have bought the M.Zuiko 90mm f 3.5 Macro 2:1 from OM-System I probably would be in the market for this lens.
